

Year 3 - Green Class

Dear Parents,

Happy New Year!

Welcome back, here is a brief outline of the main topics we will be covering this term.

In English, we will be working in blocks to develop our skills in writing story settings, fairy tales, explanations and poems as well as information writing through our History link and performance poetry. The children will all be reading and discussing texts in groups weekly as well as practising their formal comprehension skills. There will be weekly handwriting and spelling/phonics lessons focusing on spelling rules and the Year 3/4 spelling list.

In Maths we will be continuing to improve our knowledge of written methods of all four operations, with a specific focus on multiplication and division, and to apply those skills in solving real life problems. We will be extending our knowledge of length, mass and volume. We will learn to estimate and measure in a variety of units. Children will continue to have weekly times tables tests on a Thursday so please keep practising at home.

In Science we will be learning about healthy diets and different food groups. The children will learn about the importance of a balanced diet and the impact on our health. They will learn about the function of different nutrients and in which foods we can find certain nutrients. Further to human diets the children will also learn about animal diets. Children will also classify animals as omnivores, herbivores and carnivores. Children will learn about muscles and skeletons of different mammals and how they move.

In History the children will explore the key features of a typical Roman town, villas as well as families living in the town. They will look at the developments that were made during the period and discuss together which made the biggest impact on the standard of living. Children will take part in a 'Roman Day' to gain a hands on experience of how the Romans lived.

In Geography we will learn about human and physical geographical aspects of the UK. We will use maps and atlases to locate different towns and study the different features.



Art will be based on different interpretations of the sea. We will be studying art work from different artists including Vincent van Gogh. Children will use watercolours and create their own block prints to create an image of the sea.

Mrs Sagers and Mrs Hundley will be continuing with our music programme for this term where the children will learn the recorder.

In Computing we will be looking at how to develop our skills. We will be learning how to safely search for relevant information about our topics, edit and adapt the information and how we can best use the results. We will learn how to set up a spreadsheet with formulae to suit our task.

In R.E. we will be studying sacred places. We will look at different parts of the mosque and its significance. We also learn about key Islamic beliefs and how Muslims pray.

In P.E. we will be doing indoor/outdoor games which will be on a **Wednesday** afternoon. Please ensure that your child has a royal blue T-shirt, navy shorts/skirts and trainers, all clearly labelled. Please also ensure that your child has a blue tracksuit if it is slightly wet and cold. The second PE session will take place on **Thursdays**.

We will be continuing to learn French each week for half an hour using learning games, songs and drama to learn simple phrases and vocabulary as well investigating French culture.

This term your child will have spellings each week relating to ones we are learning in class. This will be recorded in their spelling books. Other homework will be sent home on Fridays and is due back in on the following Wednesday. Also please carry on reading with your child at least 5 times a week. It really does make a difference.

Please remind your child to bring in a water bottle with a **lift up lid**, as it is not always possible to go to the water fountain in school.

I am sure that you will support your child in the best way, but if there are any problems please do not hesitate to contact me.

Please aim to be on the playground for just after 8.40am so we are ready to line up when the bell goes at 8.50am to make a good start to the day.
