
Fortnite is an online shooter that starts with 100 players and leaves **one winner standing**. **Battle Royale** sees 100 players parachute onto an island, and the last player alive wins. Each game lasts about **20 minutes**

It has a PEGI rating of **12**, for 'frequent scenes of mild violence'

Although the game itself seems pretty harmless, **players can talk and type whatever they want** to each other, and bad language is rampant.

March 2018, a mother from Merseyside told how she intervened when her 12-year-old son was offered £50 to perform "sex acts" while playing the game by a man grooming him online.

Yolo: Viral Snapchat app raises abuse concerns

Yolo, an app that lets anonymous questions be posed to Snapchat users, has become the most downloaded iPhone app in the UK and US just a week after its release.

It is highly unusual for an app to top Apple's chart so soon after its launch without a major marketing campaign.

However, the viral success of the product has raised concerns.

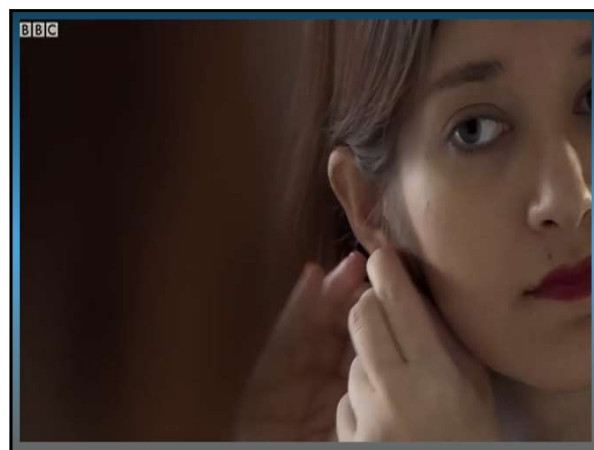

Kik

Kik is an instant messaging app which lets you share messages, photos, games and news, or organise events.

YOLO

YOLO allows you to ask anonymous questions to other users. You can connect Yolo with Snapchat

Send Safe Message- Self Destructing

Send Safe is a free service, which allows you to send a message or photo via popular apps...that **Disappears** after seen once.

Omegle

Talk to Strangers! Omegle connects you randomly to another person who's on the site, and lets you talk to them in a one-to-one video chat.

Secret Calculator

Calculator hides photos, contacts and videos behind a calculator. If you put in a passcode it will open up a private area. Able to browse internet without the history being saved.

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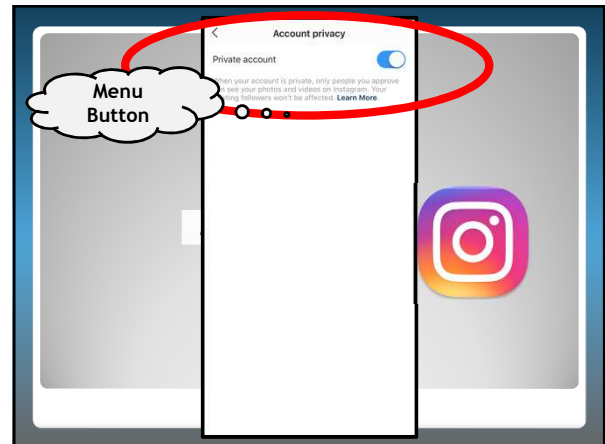
Advice for parents on Apps...

- Use a strong password

- Consider the minimum age
- Don't accept friend requests from strangers

- Tell them to think before they post

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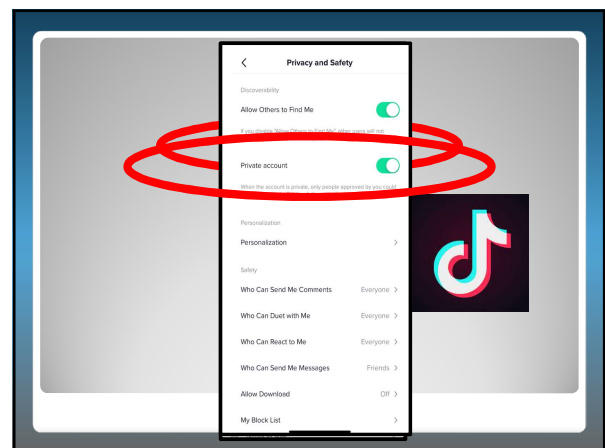
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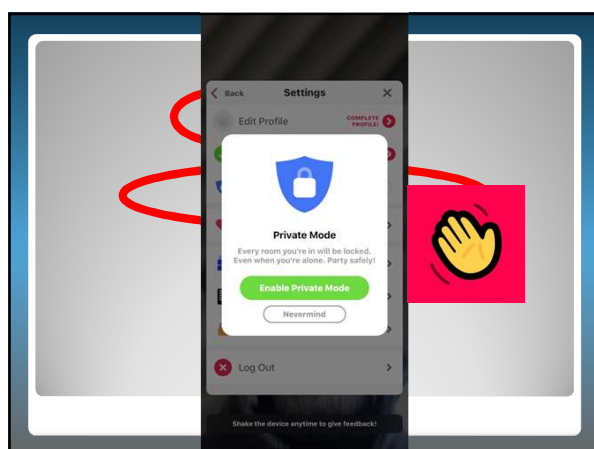
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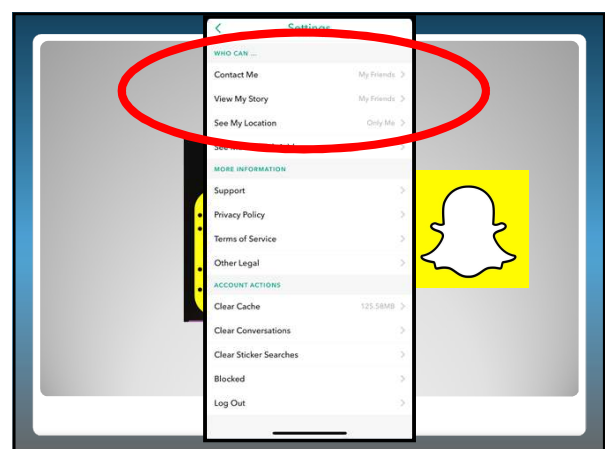
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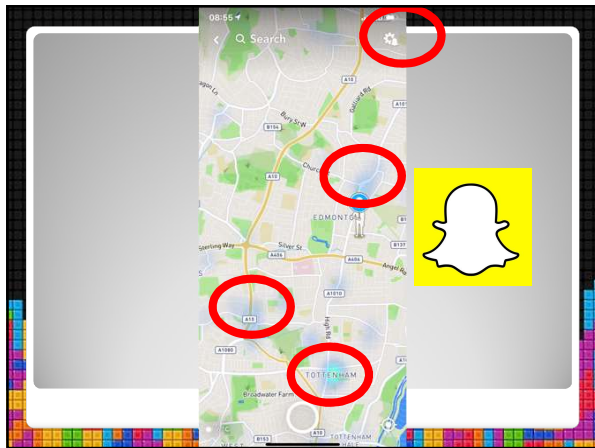
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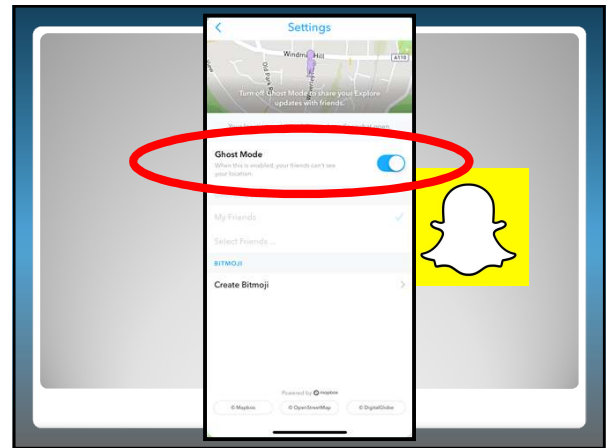
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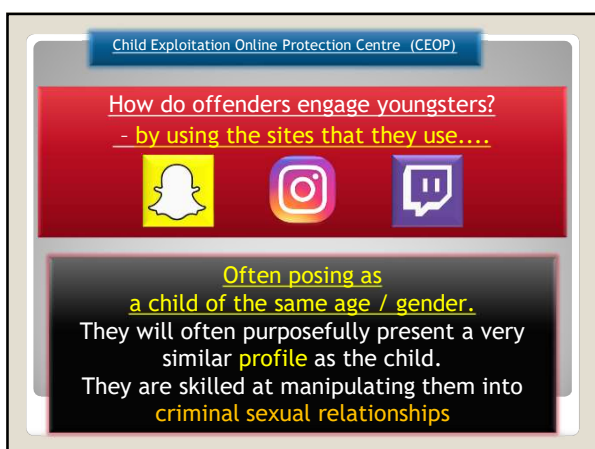
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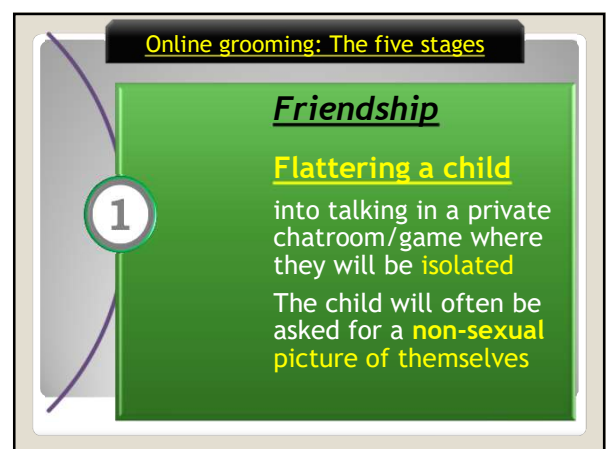

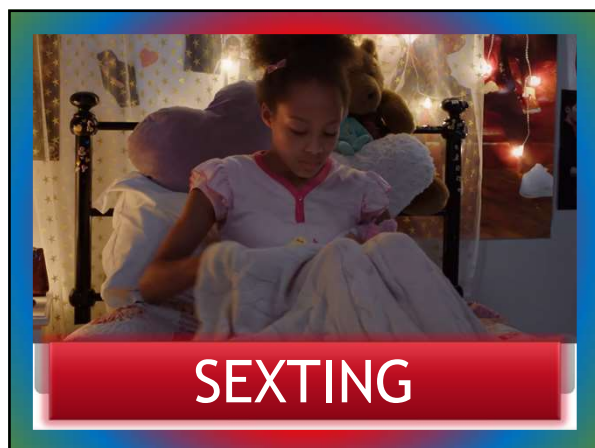
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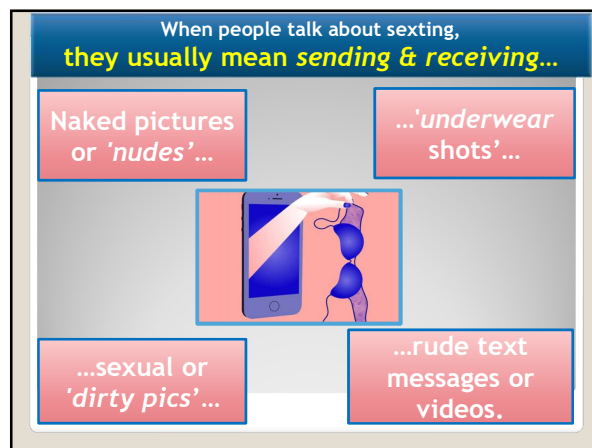
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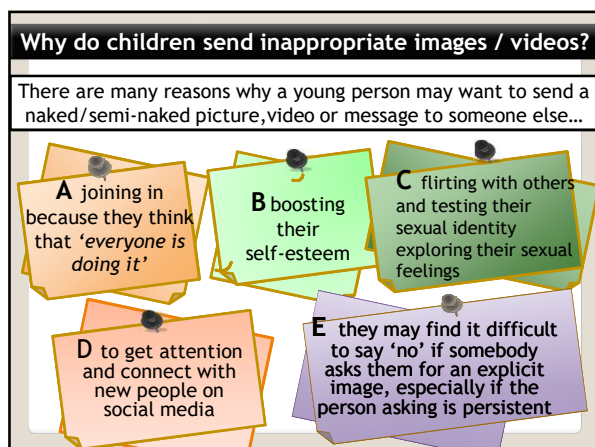
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THE LAW....

Protection of Children Act 1978
Makes it an offence to take, make, show, distribute, possess (with a view to distribute) or publish an advertisement with an indecent photograph or pseudo-photograph of a child under the age of 18.

Criminal Justice Act 1988 part XI
Makes it an offence to possess indecent images of children.

Criminal Justice and Courts Act 2015 section 33
Makes it an offence to share private sexual photographs or films with the intent to cause distress.

Sexual Offences Act 2003
Lists sexual offences and their definitions. If an image being shared is of a sexual act, police must find out whether a sexual offence has been committed and act accordingly.

Sexting boy's naked selfie recorded as crime by police

3 September 2015, UK

A boy who sent a naked photograph of himself to a girl at school has had the crime of making and distributing indecent images recorded against him by police, the BBC has learnt.

The boy, aged 14, who was not arrested or charged, could have his name stored on a police database for 10 years.

Police have only recently started filing **crime reports** about sexting...

If **school** choose to take an incident **to the police**, then officers must **record the crime**.

UK Chief Medical Officers' advice for parents and carers on Children and Young People's screen and social media use

Technology can be a wonderful thing but too much time sitting down or using mobile devices can get in the way of important, healthy activities. Here are some tips for balancing screen use with healthy living.

Sleep matters

Getting enough, good quality sleep is very important. Leave phones outside the bedroom when it is bedtime.

Sharing sensibly

Take about sharing photos and information online and how photos and words are sometimes misquipped. Parents and carers should never assume that children are happy for their photos to be shared. For everyone – when in doubt, don't upload!

Education matters

Make sure you and your children are aware of, and abide by, their school's policy on screen time.

Keep moving!

Everyone should take a break after a couple of hours sitting or lying down using a screen. It's good to get up and move about a bit. #sitlessmove more

Safety when out and about

Advise children to put their screens away while crossing the road or doing an activity that needs their full attention.

Talking helps

Talk with children about using screens and what they are watching. A change in behaviour can be a sign they are distressed – make sure they know they can always speak to you or another responsible adult if they feel uncomfortable with screen or social media use.

Family time together

Screen-free meal times are a good idea – you can enjoy face-to-face conversation, with adults giving their full attention to children.

Use helpful phone features

Some devices and platforms have special features – try using these features to keep track of how much time you spend with them. Remember, your children spend looking at screens or on social media.

“Peppa does a lot of screaming and crying and the dentist is just a bit sadistic and it's just way, way off what a three-year-old should watch” said one Mother.

Thousands of videos on YouTube look like versions of popular cartoons but contain disturbing and inappropriate content not suitable for children. If you're not paying much attention, it might look like an ordinary video featuring Peppa Pig, the cheeky porcine star of her own animated series. But soon after pressing play on the particular YouTube clip, the plot turns dark. A dentist with a huge syringe appears. Peppa's teeth get pulled out. Distressed crying can be heard on the soundtrack.
