<u>Spring Newsletter</u> Year 2 - Yellow Class

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back! I hope you had a restful and enjoyable Christmas. Here is a brief outline of the areas we will be covering in Year 2 this term:

In Literacy we will be looking at stories with repetitive language and different stories by the same author. Through these units we will be comparing and discussing what we have read and using similar writing frames to create stories of our own. We will be learning how to write non-chronological reports and will apply this to our learning in other curriculum areas. We will be exploring poetry - reading, writing and sharing opinions about the poems we have heard.

In their reading the children will be taught to read with expression and discuss what they have read. There will be a strong focus on interpreting meaning from text, authors' word choices, text layout and characters' thoughts and actions. It is important that the children have a good understanding of the stories they read, not just focusing on reading the words so please try and encourage your child to talk about their books at home - thinking about how characters might be feeling or why they might have acted in a particular way, what might happen next in the story, etc. Reading is a vital part of learning in all of the curriculum areas and it is essential that all of the children read at least 4 times a week at home. Please remember that the children can read on Bug Club and this can be recorded in their reading record as well. We appreciate your continued support with this.

Spellings will continue to be sent home weekly. Please ensure you support your child with their spellings every week. Please note that spellings are given to the children in the test in a random order.

In Numeracy we will be looking at place value and developing our knowledge and understanding when working with the four basic operations. We will look at different

measures such as length, weight and temperature and will learn to apply skills learnt in our number work to solve simple problems.

Through Science we will be looking at animals and their habitats and will explore the basic needs of all creatures, including the importance of food and exercise. In History the children will gain a better understanding of what it means to be famous and look into how things have changed over time. They will explore some famous people from History and find out how they helped to improve things for us today. In Geography we will be exploring the features of our own locality and will compare these to other places around the world. Our art work this term will also focus around a famous artist and the children will explore different collage techniques and skills to recreate famous pictures.

In RE we will be learning about 'Special Places' and 'Easter'. The children will be encouraged to share their experiences related to the topics and develop their understanding of the Christian faith.

P.E. will be on **Monday and Tuesday** each week. P.E. kit is dark blue T-shirt and shorts/skorts and trainers or plimsolls. Please ensure that your child also has dark blue jogging bottoms and top as they will be working outside as much as possible. If your child wears tights to school, please make sure that they have spare socks in their PE bag. It is important that the children have their PE kit in school from the beginning of the term and that all items are labelled clearly so that we can easily return them if they get lost. Please remember that long hair should be tied up at school and it would be advisable that earrings are not worn to school on PE days.

Our ICT unit this term is 'Talking and Sharing'. We will be exploring the different ways in which messages can be received and sent and will consider how to stay safe online. They will look at simulations on the computer, focusing on what happens as a result of choices they have made.
